Full completed applications must be submitted in English and received no later than
5pm SENDER'S TIME, MONDAY, JANUARY 15, 2018. A complete application must include the following items.

The application is web-based and begins on the next page. Review the information below, prepare the content requested, then click the >> icon at the bottom of this page to proceed to the application form.

Once you begin the web-application, you must complete it in full in one sitting for submission – please have all components ready.

1. Application Form, fully completed (web-form – recommended browser: Google Chrome)

In addition to items 2-5 below, the application form collects your administrative information, grant funding history (if applicable), names of relevant mentors, reason(s) you are interested in the Workshop, how you heard about it, how you anticipate benefiting from the Workshop, and how you anticipate the field in turn will benefit from your participation.

2. A grant proposal, maximum of 2 single -spaced pages, size 11 font (Arial, ½-inch margins) – use file upload tool on the web-form

TREC Training Workshop Faculty recognize that grant proposals will vary based on the investigator's primary discipline or academic background; however, the following basic elements must be addressed:

- a) The proposal should describe the research project in energetics and cancer that you would like to develop during the Workshop. It must **not** be a study for which you are already funded. We recommend that applicants utilize general NIH grant writing guidance (<https://grants.nih.gov/grants/how-to-apply-application-guide/format-and-write/write-your-application.htm>, accessed 9/20/17)
 - i. Describe the **specific aims, study design, and research plan**
 - ii. Describe the **significance and innovation** of your proposed study.
- b) To ensure equity in the selection process, proposals longer than 2-pages will not be considered.
- c) References are not counted in the 2-page maximum.

Proposal formatting instructions

- Size 11 font (Arial, ½ -inch margins)
- Include a document header with your first and last name
- Format the file name as follows: LastnameFirstInitial_Proposal *example: LowryD_Proposal*
- Use upload tool on the web-form (.doc or .pdf file)

3. A current biosketch using the newest NIH format

Biosketch file naming instructions

- Use upload tool on the web-form (.doc or .pdf file)

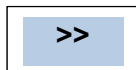
4. Two professional references (name, email address, phone) - we are not collecting letters of recommendation, just names and contact.

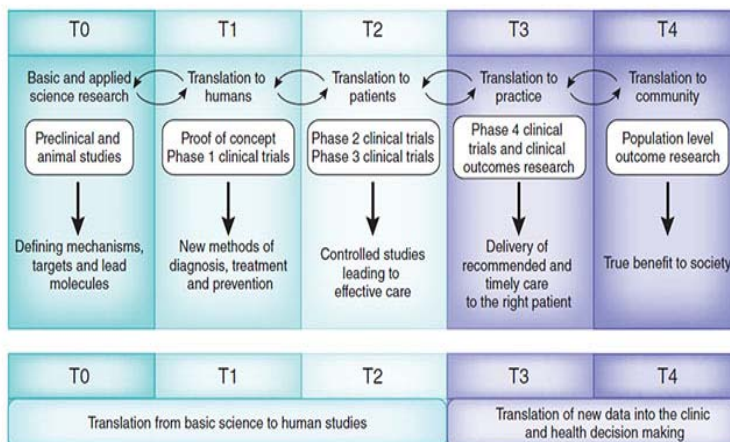
